About the Initiative

Empower School of Health, Geneva, in strategic partnership with the **Presidential Initiative to Unlock the Healthcare Value Chain (PVAC)**, is co-developing a first of its kind, series of best-in-class training centres for pharmaceutical training in Nigeria. This transformative initiative is designed to address the critical need for skilled professionals in Nigeria's pharmaceutical and vaccine manufacturing sectors, and to support the country's broader health security and self-reliance goals.



Why this matters — A National and Continental Priority

Nigeria imports 60% to 70% of its pharmaceuticals and nearly 100% of its vaccines. This over-dependence threatens health security, increases costs, and limits access. In alignment with the Africa CDC and African Union's vision for local production by 2030, this academy is a cornerstone to:

- Reduce dependency on imports
- Boost local drug and vaccine production
- Create thousands of skilled, high-value jobs
- Reverse brain drains through career pathways in Nigeria
- · Bridge the gap between education and industry



National and regional hubs delivering "5T's"

A series of **state-of-the-art training centres** will provide the 5T's to build capacity in the pharmaceutical sector, training 2,000–3,000 professionals annually while promoting youth leadership and gender equality:

- Training
- Turnkey support
- Tech Transfer
- Technical Assistance
- Troubleshooting

Phases

Phase 1: development of a digital learning platform, a modernized training unit, one Mobile-POD Training Centre (MTC), and one Comprehensive Training Centre (CTC).

Phase 2: expand to 2 CTCs, 6 MTCs, and 13 Digital Training Centres (DTCs).



Planned locations

The Comprehensive Training Centers (CTCs) will be strategically located in three key geographic hubs (southwest, southeast & northwest) of Nigeria.

The Mobile-POD Training Centers and Digital Training Centers will be distributed across all six regions of the country, including the Federal Capital Territory, ensuring nationwide coverage and outreach.
